

Grant Application Process for North Carolina Nonprofits



LOCAL AND REGIONAL NONPROFITS

STEP 1: Read directions and qualifications at duke-energy.com/FoundationNC.



STEP 2: Ask any questions of your contact person, click [here](#) for a list of contacts.



Step 3: Submit a grant application for up to \$20,000 for work in the areas of vibrant economies; climate resiliency; and justice, equity and inclusion.



Step 4: Within three months of submittal, you'll hear from Duke Energy Foundation's grant system or your Duke Energy contact.



Step 5: If your application is awarded, complete an impact report 12 months after receiving the grant award for grants greater than \$10,000.

STEP 2: Email a brief project synopsis and the amount of funding requested to CommunityAffairs@duke-energy.com.



STEP 3: Duke Energy Foundation staff will contact you with a recommendation for next steps, if any.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Each year, the Duke Energy Foundation will decide if there are additional grant opportunities available through a request for proposals process (RFP). If available, these opportunities will be announced via news release and via email to previous grantees.
